# Confirmation of the minutes of the meeting held on 8-5-2023 and matters

# Agenda Item II:

#### To consider and accept the resolutions passed by Academic Council in its

#### meeting held on August 21, 2023

Dr Archana Patki presented the resolutions passed by the Academic Council on 21-08-2023 about the implementation of the National Education Policy 2020 from the academic year 2023-24. The same were accepted by the GB members.

- To implement the NEP 2020 and prepared syllabi and curricular structure accordingly
- Departments worked and thought hard to prepare innovative courses. What appeared as amorphous in the beginning, seemed practicable later. We were surprised to learn that we could design and develop a variety of courses for every subject.
- The fillip given to regional languages in NEP is a game changer. Students who feared English now have the option of studying Marathi or Hindi; and those who want to learn an additional regional language also benefit from this.
- Initially, we believed that the workload of all the subjects which were not offered as discipline components, and yet their teachers had full timers' workload, will suffer. After the implementation of the curriculum structure, however, we realized that the workload is well-protected, and in most cases, the workload increases. (Such Subjects: English, Food and Nutrition, Child Development, Foundation Courses)
- Adhering to the curriculum structure recommended by the university, we now offer courses in all the verticals, most are innovative courses not offered as options previously.
- General Elective BA: Basics of Cooking/Traditional Games and Toys/The Role of Women in India/Literature Masterclass: Short Stories. BCom: Bus. Environment/Bus Mathematics
