# College Performance Report 2022-23

Summary: Smt Maniben MP Shah Women's College conducted several activities in AY 2022-23. Overall, college has maintained its academic standard and given opportunities to students for a holistic development. Co-curricular activities, financial aid, career advancement of faculty members, activities for the non-teaching staff are noteworthy.

The performance of the college is assessed as 'Very Good'; college has scope for further improvement.

## 1 Significant Activities

#### 1.1 Preparing for NEP and Other Structural Changes

- Sessions on implementation of NEP 2020 and on mapping of programme objectives and course objectives were conducted.
- Feedback mechanism from all stakeholders was being strengthened.
- NEP Implementation Committee was formed and orientations for teachers and students conducted about the changes under NEP.
- Mentoring system was formalized by the college. Talks were conducted on Methods of Assessment and on NEP 2020.

#### 1.2 Research, Publication, Extension

- Eight academic and eight Non-academic articles published in Srujan, a publication to encourage creative and scientific endeavours of students.
- Concept, a peer-reviewed journal was brought out.
- Publications in the year included those of college departments such as Beacon (Dept of Psychology), Meteor (Dept. of Management Studies), Surabhi (Hindi Dept), Paalavi (Marathi Dept), and PostScript (English Dept)
- Eleven (11) Research papers and two (02) books were published by the faculty members, and they also made six (06) research paper-presentations through the year.
- One (01) application for Major Research Project and two (02) for Minor Research Project were submitted to Indian Council for Social Science Research (ICSSR).

- 'Manthan', the research cell of the college, was inaugurated.
- Workshops and aptitude tests were carried out by teachers and PG Students for Rural and Urban Outreach Programme in a school in tribal area.
- A session on Patent Registration was conducted by an in-house faculty for fellow teachers.
- Nutritional Consultancy was provided to Salaam Bombay, an NGO.
- A need-based survey of the local population was conducted at Vanicha Pada, a tribal area near Aarey Colony, Goregaon, Mumbai.

### Soft Skill Training, Career Guidance, Health Awareness

- College focuses on making students aware about mental health and well being; a number of activities were held during Mental Health Week in collaboration with World Federation of Mental Health.
- . The Placement Cell in collaboration with Magic Bus, an NGO, selected TY students across faculties for soft skills programmes; three sessions / workshops were conducted to enhance students' soft skills.
- One session to improve language and communication skills was carried out for all students.
- In total, fifteen workshops/sessions on career guidance on topics such as careers in banking and sessions, career as cabin crews etc. for undergraduate students at third-year level were conducted
- UGC NET paper solving series conducted in collaboration with Ascendance Academy for post-graduate students.
- Sessions conducted on skill development for the college Alumni
- Following workshops were conducted through the year: four (04) workshops on chocolate-making, sandwich making, lip balm making and preparing party starters for all all students; one on behavioural science, one on resume-writing and interview preparation; two sessions on campus interviews.
- Breast-Feeding Awareness week was conducted, presentations on importance of nutrition were conducted.
- Seminars on Yoga in association with Nutrition Society of India for all undergraduate students.
- Talks and workshops to spread awareness about menstrual hygiene were held.

#### Other Notable Activities

- · All Statutory committees were formed for a new term according to the recommended guidelines.
- Exam results were declared on time.

- Free-ships and scholarships provided to students across all streams in graduate and post -graduate programmes; total financial aid amounted to approximately Rs. 76 lakhs.
- Two workshops on environmental issues for all students were conducted; faculty members observed 'No-Lift Day' twice through the year.
- Internal academic and administrative audit was conducted for 2021-22.
- Orientations for the first-year students of all streams were conducted.
- Three workshops were organised for enhancing usage of library resources. Book-Displays and competitions were organized in the library for all students.
- A workshop was conducted on the creation of e-content by faculty members.
- A workshop on team-building for non-teaching staff and a session on usage of INFLIBNET for post graduate students were conducted.
- Two (02) Faculty Development programmes were conducted for all teaching faculty members, and two (02) programmes were conducted for the non-teaching faculty members.

#### Significant Achievements 3

- NEP Structure was presented and approved in the Academic Council.
- MoU signed with Maharshi Dayanand College, Parel, and Dr A M Pradhan College to conduct activities related to Environment Awareness. MoU signed with Threco e-waste recycling company for collection of waste. Besides these four new MoUs were signed in the academic year with NGOs and institutes.
- Policies related to Admissions, Examination, Website, Free-ships and Scholarship, Research have been extensively revised.
- Separate Divyangjan window created for differently-abled students.
- Collaborations inked with TechnoServe Foundation for soft-skill training of stu-
- Students won following prizes in sports: two (02) in Fencing; 1st in Kabaddi; three prizes in carrom; two prizes in inter-collegiate badminton; two prizes in international karate and kick-boxing championship; one prize in tug-of-war; one in Tackewondo; one in athletics; one each in long jump, hurdle race, javelin, discuss throw and basketball.
- The college cricket team participated in the Mumbai Cricket Association (MCA) Tournament and two students were selected for inter-university championships.
- CAS Promotions of 5 faculty members were completed and 3 more verifications were completed by the IQAC.
