Laboratory Consumables

In order to ensure efficient working of the computer and food laboratories in college, purchase of related consumables are necessary. Internet Services

Internet in educational institutes has been incredibly useful as it facilitates both information and communication. The Internet has increased the accessibility of education at all levels and has turned out to be a giant repository of knowledge. The college provides free internet services to all faculty members and administrative staff for official use. Students have also been given free access to internet services for learning purposes. The Computer Laboratories are

equipped with high speed internet services for conducting its classes and other official usage.

Maintenance of Equipments

Proper maintenance of equipment is of utmost importance. Maintenance of all machinery including computers and computer peripherals are done on a regular basis to ensure the even functioning of the equipments. Department of Sociology

A session on Pre Marital Counseling by Dr. Rajan Bhonsle, a senior Consultant in Sexual Medicine and Counselor from Mumbai, practicing for 23 years, was arranged by the department of Psychology on 17th February, 2018 which was attended by all students of the department of Psychology. In his session he eloquently covered a range of topics within a short span of time like, the history and need for pre-marital counseling, He enlightened the students on Sexual health, Pre marital sex, Marital Rape and Sexual ignorance and research about it.

C Field Visits:

The students of Department of Psychology visited Yerwada Mental Hospital, Muktangan Centre and abnormal Home, Pune on 18, 19, 20 January, 2018.

Yerwada Mental Hospital:

Students observed acute patients or those capable of harming one self or other, Criminals who are mentally unfit for trial are treated in a separate, highly secured ward. Students also observed 6 sessions of Electro Convulsive Therapy to manic patients who are resistant to drugs and to patients of Schizophrenia.

Muktangan Rehabilitation Centre:

This rehabilitation centre goes beyond simply aiding the de-addiction of alcohol and drug addicted patients. Their 30 day intensive program is given on a residential basis. It involves even supporting families and caretakers- to prevent relapse. Regular follow-ups can occur at any of the widely spread centers across all the states and union territories. The centre itself has a capacity of over 200 beds currently. Post recovery, clients are connected to NGOs to encourage them to find jobs.

AB- Normal Center:

The quaint set up of bamboo surrounded classrooms, so thoughtfully and tastefully constructed, makes for a therapeutic setting. Minimal furniture is kept to enable children's free movement. The beautiful personalized bond experienced between teacher and child due to the 1:3 ratio, enables learning. The tailored Individual Education Plans (IEP) showed how respectfully children are viewed. It portrayed an environment of true growth.

D MENTAL HEALTH WEEK

The Mental Health Week by the Department of Psychology was arranged on the theme 'Mental Health in Workplace'. Students prepared slogans trying to break the myth around mental illness and the stigma attached to it. Students from the department made charts pertaining to the theme of the year. As a part of the mental health celebration the department organized sessions on 'Animal Assisted Therapy', organized a seminar on 'School Psychiatry –Handling Adolescence'.

Academic Advancement center aims at optimizing the scholastic skills of the students by providing them additional inputs in their academics apart from their curriculum. It strived to help students with weak as well as better academic backgrounds. To achieve the set objectives Academic Advancement Center conducted a number of activities as follows:

- A. Activities conducted for students with academically weak performance:
- A Remedial Language Program was conducted for FYB.Com students on 7th Feb. 2018 from 11.30am -12.30pm in the AV Room. Mrs. Usha Kumar successfully delivered the session. Topics covered were the importance and benefits of learning the English language, knowledge of articles: a, an, the, comprehension, pronunciation and Memorizing.

- A series of sessions were organized for SYB.Com students. Details of the sessions are as follows:-
- i. 5th February, 2018 Self Introduction
- ii. 7th February,2018- Time Management
- iii. 9th February,2018- Reading & Presentation skills Sessions were scheduled from 11:30 to 12:30 on all the above given days. Mrs. Pranita Pagare conducted all these sessions at scheduled time & students benefited from the same.

B. Activities conducted for students with academically better performance:

- Academic Advancement Centre in association with Growth Centre organized Academic Enrichment Program & Personal Enrichment Program for students of SYBA (44 students) & TYBA (38students) respectively on 13th December 2017, Wednesday in Room no. 14 & 24 from 9.30am to 11.30am.
- Review/Feedback session of both the programs Academic Enrichment Program & Personal Enrichment Program was done by Growth Centre on 10th Jan. 2018 Monday from 10.30 am to 12.30 pm in AV room & Room no 24 selected students of SYBA & TYBA were made to participate in these programs.
- Organized a guest lecture for the students of SYB.Com (Sem IV) for the subject
 of Commerce and for giving helpful insights for University exams. Lecture was
 held on 3rd Mar. 2018 at 9.00 am. Resource person for the lecture was Dr. Anita
 Jacob, Assistant Professor, B. M. Ruia College.

C. Conducting add-on programme on Modi Lipi and Educational Tour to Pustakanche Gao (Village of Books) for TYBA students

Modi Lipi:

Objective:

• To ensure the ancient script of great historical & cultural significance – Modi; is introduced to our Students.

Details of the Course:

- Was conducted by Mr. Rajesh Khillari, founder of "Jagati Modi Prasar Samiti", Mumbai.
- Total Duration of the course was 30 hrs.
- 2 Hour long sessions were conducted every Monday, Thursday & Saturday, from 3rd Feb 2018 till 10th March 2018
- 46 students of TYBA underwent through the course & after successful completion received their certificates, which were handed over by Prin.Dr. Leena Raje.
- Teaching methodology included, Facilitator led Lectures / Discussions & projects / presentations by students.
- Printed notes / study material was provided to every enrolled student.
- Students were taught about the script from 2 era's Peshwa Era & Shiv Era.





Outcome:

- Students are now able to read documents in Modi script.
- 5-6 Students immediately received assignments for translating documents in Modi script to other languages, post completion of this course.
- Students will now be able to monetize this newly acquired skill.

Pustakanche Gao (Village of Books):

Objective:

- To visit the Village of Bhillari, Satara Dist, Maharashtra; which is more popularly known as Pustakanche Gao (Village of Books) an initiative of Govt. Of Maharashtra.
- To ensure proliferation of a reading culture amongst our students.

Details of the Educational Visit:

- The objective of initiating this venture by the State Govt. & the villagers of Bhillari was to inculcate the habit of reading amongst the new generations & give access of maximum books to book lovers. A total of 25 houses in the village of Bhallari have been chosen, each to house 1000 books of a particular genre.25000 books are available for book lovers in the entire village. This is the first of its kind of initiative in the entire country.
- 35 Students of TYBA & 3 Asst. Prof. visited Bhillari village from 5th to 7th March 2018.
- They were able to browse through numerous books across genres.

Outcome:

- Students are now aware of the great initiatives taken State Govt. to popularize reading & bringing readers close to various literary classics across genres.
- Students are now aware of multiple reference books wrt syllabus.







D. Conduction of programme on mental health and premarital counseling

The Department of Psychology was instrumental in having Dr. Rajan Bhonsle at the college for a guest lecture on Pre Marital Counseling, on 17th February, 2018. The lecture was attended by graduate students from the department of Psychology Dr. Rajan Bhonsle, M.D., is the Founder Director of Heart To Heart Counseling Centre and Dean of the Institute of Human Technology (India). He is a senior Consultant in Sexual Medicine & Counselor from Mumbai, practicing for 23 years.

He eloquently covered a range of topics within a short span of time like, the history and need for pre- marital counseling, the four aspects he covers in his own practice at the Heart to Heart Counseling Centre at Byculla, along with his wife. He enlightened us on topics such as Sexual health, Pre marital sex, Marital Rape and Sexual ignorance and research about it. He was also instrumental in connecting theses topics to cases in India.
